ESDC HIGH LEVEL COURSE 'José Cutileiro' - Module 3 "CSDP in Action" 07-11 April 2025, Bucharest

Between **07-11.04.2025**, the National College of Home Affairs (CNAI) from "Alexandru Ioan Cuza" Police Academy, organised under the auspices of European Security and Defence College (ESDC), <u>Module 3 of the 2024/2025 CSDP High-Level Course</u> "Jose CUTILEIRO", with the coordination of the Ministry of External Affairs, having as official partners The Committee for Defence, Public Order and National Security and the Committee for Foreign Policy of the Romanian Senate, the Ministry of National Defence, and Agerpres (the National News Agency of Romania).

The event was held in the Palace of the Parliament, between 07-10.04.2025, and on 11.04.2025 the course activities took place in the Ministry of Internal Affairs Headquarters.

The CSDP High-Level Course is the anual flagship program of ESDC, having a modular structure, and every edition of the course being hosted by 4 EU Member States. This year, the training program helds its 20th edition, being a special edition, taking into consideration that ESDC celebrates its 20 years of activity in providing EU training in the field of Common Security and Defence Policy (CSDP).

At the event participated 73 representatives of EU Member States, senior civilian officials (including diplomats or law enforcement officials) or senior military officials from EU Member States, candidate countries, relevant EU institutions, bodies and agencies, as well as CSDP missions and operations.







The opening of the course took place on 07.04.2025, in the "Avram Iancu" Room of the Palace of the Parliament. The first day of the module concluded with a Welcome Cocktail, during which two exhibitions were organized: a photo exhibition titled "3 Years of War in Ukraine", created by Agerpres, and a painting exhibition featuring themes related to major historical figures and elements of Romanian tradition and identity. The artworks were created by painters from the Republic of Moldova and provided by the **UNESCO** Cultural Center "Mihai Eminescu" in Bucharest.

The programme of Module 3 included presentations on topics related to the civil and military dimensions of CSDP operational engagement and the evaluation of CSDP missions and operations, the challenges of strategic planning within the CSDP in the current geopolitical context, strategic communication

and hybrid threats, maritime security from the perspective of EUNAVFOR and Frontex operations, civil protection and humanitarian assistance in support of CSDP missions and operations, the financing of CSDP missions and operations and the European Peace Facility (EPF), as well as Romania's contribution to the Common Foreign and Security Policy and the Common Security and Defence Policy, including to CSDP missions and operations.

Internal Security Affairs in the Republic of Moldova.

The module agenda also included a debate on the topic "Building the Member States' Legislative Support for the EU Agenda on CSDP. Case Studies: The Security Context of the Eastern EU (Ukraine War)", with the participation of H.E. Mr. Ihor Prokopchuk – Ambassador of Ukraine to Romania, H.E. Mr. Victor Chirilă – Ambassador of the Republic of Moldova to Romania, Mr. Lucien Tallet – representative of the French Embassy in Bucharest, and Mr. Teofil Parasca – Senator, member of the Committee for Defence, Public Order and National Security. The debate was moderated by Mr. Dan Cărbunaru – Director of Calea Europeană and former spokesperson of the Romanian Government.

As part of the module's activities, the participants visited the *DIGITAL INNOVATION SUMMIT BUCHAREST*, held at the Palace of the Parliament and organized by the National Institute for Research and Development in Informatics (ICI) Bucharest, under the coordination of the Chamber of Deputies and the Government of Romania. CNAI participated as an official partner institution. The focus topic for this activity within the module was "Emerging Threats and Challenges: Hybrid Threats, Critical Infrastructure Protection, Cyber Security/Defense".

The final day of the module took place at the Ministry of Internal Affairs headquarters – *the Marble Hall*. Before the start of the scheduled activities, Chief Police Commissioner Alin Banu – *General Secretariat of the Ministry of Internal Affairs* – gave the participants a brief presentation of the Ministry of Internal Affairs Palace and Revolution Square, highlighting the historical events that took place there, significant both nationally and internationally.

The final panel (Strategic Lecture) of the module highlighted Romania's contribution to the Common Foreign and Security Policy (CFSP), the Common Security and Defence

One of the course panels took place at the Presidential Administration headquarters, focusing on the theme "High-Level Debate on the EU Priorities. Eastern Flank of the EU. A Strong and Secure Europe", coordinated by retired General Prof. Dr. Teodor Frunzeti. The activity was followed by a visit to the Cotroceni Museum.

On 10 April 2025, the *Official dinner* was hosted by CNAI with the support of the CNAI Foundation, bringing together participants, course lecturers, representatives of the organizing institutions, and invited guests. The event took place at *Club Excelsior/Ministry of Internal Affairs* and was opened by Ambassador Viorel Isticioaia Budura – former

Policy (CSDP), as well as to CSDP missions and operations. The panel was coordinated by Ms. Irina Zidaru – Director General of the Strategic Affairs Department within the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, together with Principal Police Commissioner Ştefan Săvulescu – Director General of the Directorate for Operational Management within the Ministry of Internal Affairs.

The course concluded with closing remarks delivered by Police Commissioner, Associate Professor Dr. Cătălin Andruș, as *Director of Module 3*, and Mr. Fernando Moreno, *Course Director*.
